Eligibility

Thirty open team competitive events will be offered at the 2019 Fall Motivational Rally. Eight events are exclusive to Middle Level members. Each chapter may enter multiple teams of 1-5 members in each event. Each team will take a collective test. There is no limit to the number of teams a chapter can enter in any event. Additionally, members may be a part of multiple teams taking different tests. However, no member may be a member of multiple teams taking the same test. It is recommended that members take the tests as a team rather than an individual to take advantage of the collective knowledge of a team.

Competitors who have competed in an event at a previous NLC are not eligible to compete on a team that includes a test in that event.

Registration

There is no advance registration for any of the open competitive events. Tests will be given out on a first-come, first-served basis. Teams may line up beginning at 1:00 behind the respective event marker. A certain number of copies of each test will be made. Once an event has run out of test copies, teams wishing to compete in that event must wait for another team to turn in their test. Once a team turns in its test, it is eligible to get in line to take a different test.

Guidelines

Team members are not allowed to mark on the test or take a test apart. When a team receives a test, the time will be marked on the Scantron form. Teams will have thirty (30) minutes to return the test. Any test returned after thirty (30) minutes will be disqualified. Teams should use a watch to keep track of time. Tests will be given from 1:00 to 3:00. A team must be in line at 2:45 to receive a test. **ADVISERS WILL NOT BE PERMITTED TO HANDLE TESTS OR CHECK OUT TESTS. ADVISERS WILL NOT BE PERMITTED TO ENTER THE TESTING AREA.**

While team members may work together, team members may not refer to other reference materials or other individuals outside of their team in answering the questions. Additionally, members may not discuss the test with others until after 3:00.

At least one member of the team must have a **sharpened #2 pencil** as the answers will be recorded on a Scantron form. Pencil sharpeners will not be provided. Team members may only use a **basic four-function calculator**. Scientific, graphic, financial calculators are not permitted and teams caught using these calculators will be disqualified. Teams may not use a calculator on a cell phone or tablet either. However, teams may purchase a mechanical pencil for \$1 or calculator for \$5 if they forget to bring one. Teams should also bring an empty **clipboard** to use when taking the test as students will not be able to sit at tables while taking the test. **The use of cell phones, tablets, or other electronic devices is prohibited.**

Test will be graded by a machine. Ties will be broken by comparing the performance of the affected teams' last ten questions of the test. Results will be announced and awards will be given to the chapter at the Fall Leadership Conference.

Awards

Awards will be awarded to the top three (3) winners in each event for high school division and top two (2) winners in each event for middle level division (prizes are per team, not per team member):
